Outside of our own spaces, we have been taking advantage of Waynesboro's vibrant Main Street Park for many activities. Several Live Music Fridays have been held there to safely accommodate listeners. Despite the rain, our 2021 **Jammin' in the Park** event showcased nine local bands, four food trucks, and many art vendors for a jam-packed day celebrating local art. Twelve area singer-songwriters shared original music in the park for our free **Local Original Music Day** event. And in partnership with Mainstreet Waynesboro, **Food Truck Fridays** and the **Summer Concert Series** provided great opportunities for people to come together and enjoy local music while also promoting our great downtown area and its businesses. On top of in-person events, we maintain an active social media presence and send weekly eblasts to share news of all the exciting arts happenings around town. Last year, we even started an online shop for Gallery 50, giving people the opportunity to browse and purchase over 350 works of art and handcrafted items. And by the end of this year, we hope to launch a new website that better showcases our mission and the progress we have made.

**Truly, we stand proud, knowing we have come a long way.** Despite the pandemic, we are doing well and look forward to the future of the arts in Waynesboro, especially as we move ahead into safer times.

Since we launched our Destination ARTS! programs, other organizations have joined us in our revitalization efforts. The town has grown in exciting ways, with craft breweries, a distillery, Main Street Park, a growing number of high-quality restaurants, a coffee shop, a book store—and new businesses opening as we speak. We admire their own efforts in keeping our community safe, and we are grateful for your support of local businesses during these times.

We are blown away by our own successes and that of many other area businesses and organizations—it is such a remarkable accomplishment for our growing town. **And none of that would be possible without support from people like you!** We are lucky to be part of a community that sees value in the arts, which is evident by the classes that sell out, the successful turnouts at new art exhibit receptions, the sales of local artwork, and the attendance at live, local music performances.
